Mrs Shirley Ormsbee wife of deceased member Bill Ormsbee SF2 recently sent to the "Compton Newsletter" a letter from Captain Lewis K Worthing, to Bill's family outlining the upcoming the 1962 Med cruise and what the Compton was scheduled to do during that six month period. (sixty years ago)

The ship left Newport in February 1962. About halfway into the mission, Commander Worthing then notified Bill's family what the Compton was scheduled for the balance of the year

Most interesting is looking at the below revised schedule and where the ship was to be in OCTOBER 1962 from October 5th to the 26th—The Boston Navy Shipyard.

On October 22, 1962, President John F Kennedy went on national television to declare Cuba was installing ballistic missiles and they were a direct threat to the security of the United States.

The USS Compton DD705 was sitting in drydock without any ammunition on board. We went on a defense condition schedule and to prepare the Compton for possible conflict.

Our drydock was flooded and the ship headed to New Jersey to reload its ammunition and head to Cuba.

We were in the middle of the boycott, I remember our ship patrolling directly outside Havana's Three mile territory limits. Compton was next ordered to our Navy base in Mayport, Florida.

At Mayport Naval Base there were multiple aircraft carriers and transport ships ready to load supplies and thousands of marines and prepare for the coming invasion.

Thank God, cooler heads prevailed and the conflict ended. Only the USS Compton got shafted as the official records never listed our participation in the 1962 Cuban Missile Crisis.

Rodney R Boyer BMSN (1960-1961) passed in Colon, Michigan on November 12, 2021. He was born on April 10, 1941 in Sturgis, MI and was 80 years of age on his passing.

Mr Boyer retired as a BM1 after completing 20 years of service in the United Navy. He then returned to the Sturgis area and started a new career with Grumman Olson Company where he spent thirty years of productive service until his second retirement. He married his wife Rose in 1962 in Newport RI on April 10, 1962 and was married for 59 years. Rodney was an active Compton Association member.
