Updates – USS Sullivan DD537

As we have heard, the Sullivan suffered a hull breach in late October 2022 and a team from the Buffalo Naval Park and the City of Buffalo worked to stabilize the ship and then evaluate its future.

After a thorough survey of the three based ships, including the Sullivan, at the naval yard. The best option for the Sullivan is now clear. However, the necessary funds needed for the proper repairs are still not available.

The repair committee is working with political leaders and private funds to obtain that goal.

Getting the Sullivan to a proper repair facility is a bit more complex and the cost exceeds the expectations of those involved. Part of the plan involves releasing all the Naval Park ships outboard the Sullivan from the encapsulates river silt to free up the channel and then moving it to the repair facility.

When at the drydock, there will be other unknown cost that currently would be difficult to estimate.

Obituaries: USS Compton DD705



Page K Evans TM3 (1947—1948) passed on June 5, 2021 in Littlestown PA at 97 years of age. He was born in Havre De Grace, Maryland on December 9, 1923. He served on the USS Compton and the USS Tillmon in all three theaters of World War II, and was a Torpedo-man. After the war Page worked at the Aberdeen Proving Grounds and the NASA Marshall Space Flight Center and on the Apollo 11 space mission. His advocation after retirement was as a re-enactor for Civil War events.



Gerry Pierce SN (1946—1949) was born in Brockton MA on June 1, 1928 and when graduating from high school in 1946 immediately joined the US Navy. After his naval service he attended Becker Junior College and graduated with an Associated Degree in Accounting and Business Administration. General Electric recruited for their business training program. Gerry retired in April 1989 as the manager of Executive Compensation Administration.



William Olson IC3 (1963—1966) Born in Southbridge MA on November 11, 1943 and passed on Wednesday June 22, 2023 at the age of 79 years. Bill's time on the Compton was during the period of the Vietnam War. Upon his honorable discharged from the United States Navy he worked as an electrician for Gentex for many years until his retirement. He was predeceased by his wife Norma, three sons and a daughter. Bill's brother, Michael is also an active Compton Association member. Our memorial donation in his honor was made to Tin Can Sailors.
