





What ship holds the war record for "most submarines sunk"????

The world record for sinking submarines belongs, not to a destroyer or an aircraft carrier, but to one of our little brothers, a humble Destroyer Escort the USS England DE635, a Buckley class, Destroyer Escort.

Crew: 186 Weight: 1400 tons

Armament (3) 3inch guns. 12 anti-aircraft guns



The USS England sank six Japanese submarines in just 12 days during May 1944. She bristled with anti-submarine weapons including two depth charge racks at the ship's stern, eight K-guns that shot depth charges out to 150 yards and a British designed, very deadly, 24 barrel Hedgehog anti-submarine mortar.

When the ship first entered the war zone it was under the command of LtCdr Walton Pendleton and also during the record sinking of those Japanese subs. However, a great amount of credit for the efficient attacks on those submarines must be given to the Executive Officer, LtCdr John Williamson, who ultimately became the ship's Captain.

On the Internet Wikipedia site you can follow each of those individual sinkings of those enemy submarines.

The England was then struck by a suicide bomber which resulted in a loss of 37 officers and men. She was able to get back to a dry dock for repairs. However, WW2 ended and it was decided not to repair the ship.

DD635 was commissioned on December 12, 1943 and decommissioned on October 15, 1945. A very short life cycle for that amazing record.





Obituaries: USS Compton DD705



Marshall T Slayton, Captain USN (Ret) passed May 27, 2023 in Portsmouth, RI. Marshall was born in Manchester NH on May 1, 1931. He received a congressional appointment to the United States Navy Academy and graduated in 1955, Future Captain Slayton's first assignment after graduating was to the USS Compton in Newport RI and assigned to the Engineering Department.



James H Maynard Jr., PN2 (1950-1951) born July 24, 1929 in Irvington, New Jersey. He passed in the Plainfield NJ area on September 10, 2023 after a brief illness at 94 years of age. After his Honorable Discharge, James obtained an Associate Business degree and spent the majority of his career as the Purchasing Manager for Muller Machinery Inc. He was extremely involved with his church, St Joseph, Plainfield NJ. As a Compton Association member. A donation, in his name, was made to TCS.



Frederick "Fred" Bowman (Circa 1958-1959) born July 31, 1933 in Battle Creek, Michigan and passed November 27, 2022. Fred was a fellow shipmate of recently deceased Compton member, Boyd Crannell. Very little is known of his time on the Compton, Fred was a Research and Development Scientist at the Kellogg Company and retired after 39 years of service. RIP Mr. Fred Bowman.
