Ybor City is a historic neighborhood in <u>Tampa</u>, <u>Florida</u>, located just northeast of <u>downtown</u>. It was founded in the 1880s by <u>Vicente Martinez-Ybor</u> and other <u>cigar</u> manufacturers and was populated by thousands of immigrants, mainly from <u>Cuba</u>, <u>Spain</u>, and <u>Italy</u>.

Ybor City has been designated as a <u>National Historic Landmark District</u>, and <u>several structures</u> in the area are listed in the <u>National Register of Historic Places</u>.

In 2008, 7th Avenue, the main commercial thoroughfare in Ybor City, was recognized as one of the "10 Great Streets in America" by the <u>American Planning Associations</u> for the millions of cigars it made annually.


- II. President Heidecker explained there would be no need for an election of officers as long as no present member wanted to become one. We (The Association) would maintain the same staff until so.





Maurice R Ouellette—MMC passed July 26 2018 in Milan NH. Maurice entered the navy when he was 17, during WW2, and served for 22 years until his retirement, he was assigned to the Compton from 7/1//1959 until 5/1/1961. Chief Ouellette was a past Compton Association Member. He was preceded in his passing by his wife Sylvia.



Stephen M Vermiglio—RM3, USS Compton 1951 to 1955, passed September 6, 2017 at 86 years of age in Hamden CT. Stephen was a early Association member attended the first two Compton Association reunions and was instrumental in setting up the third reunion in Newport RI. He enjoyed card trips to Atlantic City and was an active member of the Masonic Temple out of Wallingford CT.



George E Sawchuck—ET2, on the Compton 1951 to 1952, passed September 14, 2015 at his home in Auburn, New York. George was 86 years old when he passed. He attended an early Compton Reunion. George was born in Centralia PA, notorious for it's mine fire which made the city mostly inhabitable. George transferred to the Compton from our sister ship the USS Gainard DD706. He was employed by the General Electric Co until retirement.



Gary Eugene Anschutz, passed September 5, 2018 in Hays, Kansas. Gary was born June 13, 1940 in Hays. His rate or rank is unknown but, he is listed as serving in the U S Navy from 1962 until 1968 on the USS Compton and on the USS Arcadia, AD 23. Military Honors and a memorial will be accorded to him on September 29, 2018 by VFW Post 6240.
