Ybor City is a historic neighborhood in <u>Tampa, Florida</u>, located just northeast of <u>downtown</u>. It was founded in the 1880s by <u>Vicente Martinez-Ybor</u> and other <u>cigar</u> manufacturers and was populated by thousands of immigrants, mainly from <u>Cuba</u>, <u>Spain</u>, and <u>Italy</u>.

Ybor City has been designated as a <u>National Historic Landmark District</u>, and <u>several</u> <u>structures</u> in the area are listed in the <u>National Register of Historic Places</u>.

In 2008, 7th Avenue, the main commercial thoroughfare in Ybor City, was recognized as one of the "10 Great Streets in America" by the <u>American Planning</u> <u>Associations</u> for the millions of cigars it made annually.





United States WW2, Secret Naval Base "Ulithi"

In March 1945, 15 battleships, 29 carriers, 23 cruisers, 106 destroyers, and a train of oilers and supply ships sailed from "a Pacific base." What was this base? The mightiest force of naval Power ever assembled must have required a tremendous supporting establishment. Ulithi, the biggest and most active naval base in the world was indeed tremendous but it was unknown. Few civilians had heard of it at all. By the time security released the name, the remarkable base of Ulithi was a ghost. The war had moved on to the Japanese homeland, and the press was not printing ancient history about Ulithi.

The US kept this place unknown to the citizens of the US. It was 1944 and the pictures were not available during the war. This is quite a story!!

This armada of ships and airplanes was poised for the invasion of Japan that never happened, because President Truman authorized the dropping of "A" bombs at Nagasaki and Hiroshima that resulted in the Japanese surrender.

Just think of the American lives that would have been lost had this invasion occurred. Be thankful that we had a President with the courage to make the call. Sadly most Americans today know nothing about this and the sacrifices made by those before us.

If any of you folks had fathers, grandfathers or uncles in the Navy during World War II, they may well have been involved in this operation, given the tremendous number of the ships and personnel involved.

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


